



Interview with Katie Riley

How long have you been interested in Speech and Drama? According my parents, I have always been a little bit dramatic! Honestly, I have always been interested in "make-believe" and dressup. In year 2 my class teacher pulled me aside during Eisteddfod practice (I thought I was in trouble!) and told me that the lady who was helping our whole class was going to give me individual drama lessons! Thus began 10 years of lessons with Margaret Heiligar.

Can you still remember the first poem you learnt? Yes- It was called the Cat's Chair by Annette Kosserris

What is the best thing about teaching drama?

The best? That's a hard one! There are so many wonderful things. One of my favourite things though is to see students grow. Even the smallest achievement is still an achievement- I love seeing them blossom and reach new Personal Bests.

How old were you when you became a qualified speech and drama teacher? I was 16 in year 11 at school when I

completed my Certificate of Voice and Communication (CVCA) with AMEB and 17 (only two weeks after my HSC!) when I completed my Associate Diploma in Speech and Drama- Performance (ATCL) with Trinnity College, London. The best thing about Speech and Drama, however, is there is always something to learn.



What was your favourite character to perform?

As a child, my favorite was Anne of Green Gables- a redhead! But more recently, I have had a chance to perform Miss Vivie Warren from Mrs Warren's Profession and loved it! Such a meaty character! I have even been nominated for "Best in Show" with Canberra Area Theatre Awards for my depiction.


